SAFETY SPOTLIGHT

UTILITY CART SAFETY

To help reduce or prevent injuries and property damage when operating this type of vehicle, follow the tips below:

Pre-operation:

- Complete annual utility cart safety training (available in-person or online through ASCIP E-Learning)
- Use a safety checklist and inspect vehicle prior to use
- Report any mechanical or equipment defects
- Read and observe all warning labels on the cart

Operation:

- Utility carts should only be operated by authorized staff who have completed training
- Check the area behind the cart before reversing and be attentive while driving
- Operate the vehicle at an appropriate speed for the terrain and observe all traffic laws
- Use curb cuts for navigating from roadways to sidewalks or from sidewalks to sidewalks
- Yield to all pedestrians. If the vehicle is being operated on a sidewalk, pull off the sidewalk or stop until approaching pedestrian passes
- Brake to control speed when traveling down an incline

Turning:

- Due to the small size and limited visibility of the turn signals on a cart, use hand signals
- Check blind spots before turning
- Avoid sharp turns at maximum speed, and drive straight up and down slopes to reduce the risk of passenger ejections and/or rollover
- Avoid excessive speed, sudden starts, stops and fast turns

Passengers:

- Do not exceed maximum occupancy limits
- Overloading a cart with passengers or cargo can cause an unsafe load on the cart
- Do not allow anyone to ride standing in the vehicle or on the back platform of the vehicle
- Do not put vehicle in motion until all passengers are safely seated inside vehicle



Parking:

- When parking, place gear lever in "neutral" position and firmly press the brake to engage the parking brake
- When leaving a utility vehicle or cart unattended, the vehicle should be taken out of gear and ignition should be turned off
- Never leave keys in a cart while unattended
- Always park on pavement unless the cart is specifically designed and used for ground maintenance
- Park in designated "Service Utility Vehicle" or other designated parking when available
- Sidewalks or pedestrian pathways should not be blocked when parking or stopping
